





A Brief History of Residential School

- Purpose: learn English, read the bible and convert to Christianity
- Constitution Act, 1867 (aka BNA) government responsibility over 'Indians'
- Indian Act, 1876 education
- Remove children from cultural and family influence

Residential School Objectives

- ► Assimilation into white society
- ► End the "Indian Problem"







National Healing Forests

Create outdoor, green spaces for reconciliation, partnerships, building community and connecting people to nature.





Planning and Partnership in Developing a Healing Forest - Community Level

- **▶** Communities
 - **▶** People
 - **▶** Grassroots
 - **►**You
- Indigenous partners are a core requirement
 - First Nation, Metis, Inuit

Core Steps to Creating a Healing Forest

- ► Assemble a small group of like-minded, caring people
- Partner with an Indigenous community within the traditional territory where your Healing Forest will be located
- ► Meet as necessary to create a vision for your Healing Forest
- ► Find a suitable location and engage the owners or managers of that land
 - ► E.g., if a city park, obtain permission from city council
- ► Gather community interest in the healing forest and express why the project is important for reconciliation
- ► Hold a ceremony to dedicate the Healing Forest space
- Consider using established graphic signifying a Healing Forest

Healing Forest Possibilities

- Outdoor gathering place Elder teaching, sharing
- Walking trails and native species
- Tree planting or use of sacred medicines
- Garden memorials with names
- Children's honoring park
- Limitless possibilities imagination!





Progress to date

- Now 18 Healing Forests in Canada 30+ more being planned - All unique and community-developed
- ► Thesis done on Healing Forest
- Royal Canadian Geographic Society is using the Healing Forest to teach about reconciliation (teaching module available)
- David Suzuki Foundation is partnering with the National Healing Forests initiative - funds for community Healing Forest
- Network of Nature now a partner to help share news and identify funding options


Cost of a Healing Forest?

- Extremely variable all depends on the vision of the community
- All Saints Anglican Church, Ottawa \$5,000
- Riverside Public School, Cape Breton \$100,000
- Fitch Bay, Quebec (private land) \$1000
- Each Healing Forest is unique there is no one model, size or design.

Some Key Challenges?

- Gaining trust and cooperation of appropriate Indigenous people (s) or organizations - takes patience and respect, but this, too, is part of reconciliation
- ► Funding always a challenge; sources do exist at many governance levels and through foundations.
- ► Momentum relationship-building takes time and patience. Successful Healing Forest champions keep going because the purpose, vision and motivation drivers are strong
- Relationship-building with Indigenous communities may take a year or more - take the time to develop organically


Partnership & Reconciliation
